Matty suffered from terminal cancer for about 18 months and during this time was adamant that he continue to serve the Men's Shed Community. Matty was a founding member of the Alexandra Hills Men's Shed and attended, when health permitted, up until the last week of his life. His mainstay in life was his devoted and caring wife Jenny who gave of herself enormously to encourage Matty in his interests in Men's Shed Business. I visited with Matty and Jenny the day before he returned to hospital for the last time. It was a privilege and an inspiration to spend a couple of hours with them. Matty was still vitally interested in what was happening within the Men's Shed movement and offered many great suggestions. He had an unwavering passion about the QMSA and his fellow committee members and wanted to have a strong and vibrant State Organisation. I sincerely believe his vision is the reality of the future for all of us. I, as many of you that knew Matty, will miss him very much. We have lost a real gem.

We held a wake on the 10th of February where family and friends numbering approximately 70 people gathered at the shed and enjoyed a few drinks and nibbles and of course the obligatory

sausage sizzle. The new Patio proved very usable and a lasting monument to the expansion of the initial shed.
